<p><b>Summary:</b></p> <p>The Assembly is asked to note with deep regret that following a short illness former Councillor John Dias Broughton passed away on Wednesday, 10 September 2014.</p> <p>John Dias Broughton was first elected as Councillor for the Parsloes Ward in 1982. He remained on the Council until 1994. He served on various Council meetings over the period including the former Establishment, Technical Services, Social Services, Planning and Development, Highways and Planning, Education, Libraries, Contractual Services and Dagenham Town Show Committees and the Road Safety Council.</p> <p>He was also an active member on the Joint Tenants Liaison Council and Barking Arts Council. He served as a School Governor at the former Erkenwald School as well as Eastbury Infants, Gascoigne, Ripple and Thames View infants and Juniors Schools.</p> <p>He leaves a wife, six children, twenty-four grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.</p>
