## Summary

This report outlines the decision of the Scrutiny Management Board (SMB) following the Call-In of the Executive decision of 20 January 2009 to roll out the wheelie bin system of household refuse collection across the Borough following the results of pilots that have taken place in five areas of the Borough.

The SMB listened carefully to the questions and answers and felt very strongly that there had been confusion over how the analysis of the pilot was to be reported back and to whom. As a result they are asking the Executive to defer the implementation of the scheme in order to give all Members of their respective parties the opportunity to receive a presentation, thus allowing them to ask questions on how the roll out of the scheme will affect constituents before a final decision is made.

The SMB also placed on record its concerns that despite raising this issue as part of its consideration of the Forward Plan on two separate occasions, no further information had been forthcoming.

A copy of the Executive's decision on 20 January is attached at Appendix A for ease of reference.
