#### 1551 Apologies for Absence

An apology for absence was received on behalf of Councillors B Tebbutt and A Weinberg. An apology for late arrival was received from Councillor S Kelly (1.28pm) and Councillor P Murphy (1.35pm).

#### **1552 Minutes (4 February 2008)**

We have confirmed as correct the minutes of our meeting held on 4 February 2008.

#### 1553 Contract Performance - 1 April 2007 to 31 January 2008

Received and noted the Assistant Executive Director's report and appendices. We have received commentary from the Executive Director that tonnage was more or less as expected, and the Temporary Transfer Station was now closed for the construction of the orange bag facility, requiring the diversion of Newham's bulky waste to Edmonton. The Bio Mrfs were working normally and successfully and Ilford Recycling Centre coped with extra wastes from Redbridge and the Reuse & Recycling Centres were running smoothly.

The recycling figure for the period April and January was lower than projected at 16.5%.

Diversion from Landfill is reported to be better than projected at 44.5% and the total LATS surplus is 54874 although there is no market for the sale of these at present.

We have noted the report, together with the appendices but we are concerned about recycling performance.

#### 1554 Budgetary Control Report to 31 January 2008

We have noted the Finance Director's report and received the Finance Manager's commentary that the underspend of £113,000 was mainly as a result of an underspend on revenue contingencies. He stated that there were some outstanding issues and uncertainties facing the Authority but that an underspend could result for the year and this would be fed back to Revenue Reserves at the end of the year.

#### 1555 Private Business

We have resolved to exclude the public and press from the remainder of the meeting by reason of the nature of the business to be transacted that included the detailed financial proposals of Shanks.east london in respect of the IWMS Contract, which is exempt from publication by virtue of paragraph 3 of Part I of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 as amended.

#### 1556 Annual Budget and Service Delivery Plan 2008/09

In accordance with Minute 1539, we have received the Executive Director's confidential report and appendices. The Executive Director also provided commentary on the background to the report and developments subsequent to our last meeting. Following a recent meeting between the Managing Director and Group Chief Executive of Shanks, to discuss our concerns, officers have recommended approval of the ABSDP.

We have expressed our discontent at recycling performance and our doubts about projections for 2008/09. We have sought advice from the Legal Adviser on our position and requested a report on the options available to the Authority if poor recycling performance continues.

Following lengthy discussion, we have noted the recommendations and approved the ABSDP and asked officers to provide further reports.

We have also requested that a special meeting be arranged in July to consider first guarter 2008/09 performance against the agreed ABSDP.

#### 1557 Waste Strategy for England 2007

Councillor Kelly enquired about meeting the Government's new waste strategy which included higher targets. Local targets, under the new Local Government Performance Framework, have not yet been set within the Constituent Councils. We have agreed that the Authority should prepare a plan of recycling in the future when national and local strategies have been confirmed.

#### 1 Purpose

1.1 To report on the performance of the Integrated Waste Management Strategy (IWMS) Contract for the period April 2007 to February 2008.

#### 2 Tonnage Data and Contract Payments

2.1 As can be seen from Appendix A the waste delivered in February was 38k tonnes, approximately 2k tonnes more than anticipated in the Annual Budget & Service Delivery Plan, however the total tonnage to date is still 2.5k below the original estimate for 2007/8.

#### 2.2 Site Operations

- 2.3 The construction of the new orange bag Mrf continues as programmed. This is the last piece of the infrastructure to be built under the IWMS contract.
- 2.4 All other sites continue to operate satisfactorily.

#### **3 Contract Monitoring**

- 3.1 February's recycling performance improved due to the increase in glass recyclate out of the Bio Mrf's. This however will not significantly affect the end of year performance. Based upon the performance for the first 11 months, the achievement of the 22% contract recycling target for 2007/08 looks impossible. The best estimate for the full year is 17%.
- 3.2 Appendix B shows the recycling and composting performance for April 07 to February 08 compared to the agreed revised plan proposed by Shanks for 2007/08 and compared to performance for 2006/7.

#### 4 Diversion from Landfill

- 4.1 The contractual target for diversion from landfill is 40% for 2007/08. This target is being exceeded with a cumulative diversion of 44.2%. This increased diversion provides the Authority with a potential Landfill Allowances Trading Scheme (LATS) benefit and landfill tax savings.
- 4.2 The performance against LATS allowances for 2007/08 is shown at Appendix C, and shows a surplus of 62244 allowances for the above period i.e. a greater diversion of biodegradable waste from landfill than was necessary to meet the government target.

#### 5 Conclusion

- 5.1 Overall waste levels for this period has increased compared to 2006/07 and is only slightly lower than projected in the 2007/8 Annual Budget & Service Delivery Plan.
- 5.2 Recycling and composting performance for the period April 07 to February 08 averaged 16.5% compared to the 22% recycling performance required under the contract. Shanks continue to suffer a loss in financial supplements arising from the lower than required recycling performance.
- 5.3 The 44.2% diversion from landfill is better than projected which reflects the continued success for the Secondary Recovered Fuel (SRF) recovery.

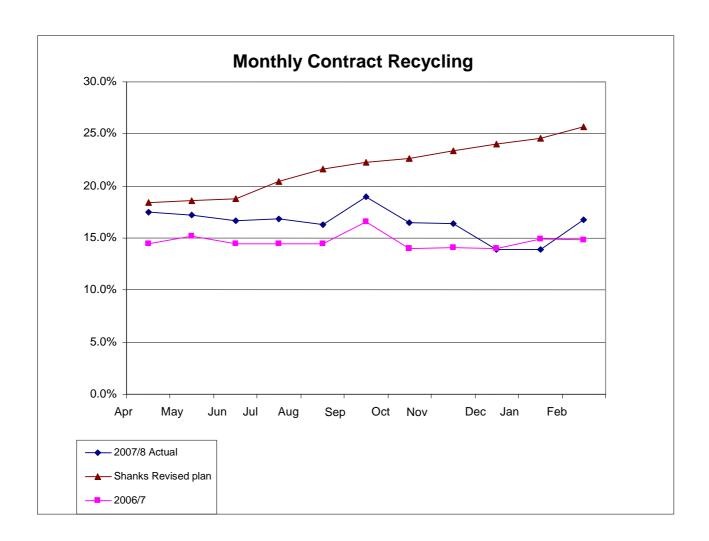

#### 1 Introduction

- 1.1 This budgetary control report compares ELWA's actual expenditure for the eleven months ended 29<sup>th</sup> February 2008 with the revised revenue estimates approved in February 2008 and is based on information supplied by Shanks.east london and the four Councils.
- 1.2 Budgetary control reports are presented for monitoring and control purposes.

#### 2 Revenue Estimates

- 2.1 Based on the profiled revised budget of £35,304,000 and the actual net expenditure on services of £35,214,000, the underspend for the period is £90,000 (see Appendix A).
- 2.2 The variations relate to the payment to Shanks.east london which is higher than the revised budget by £145,000 principally due to over 1,900 more tonnes requiring disposal during February 2008 than previously forecast (see Assistant Executive's separate report elsewhere on the agenda on Contract Performance for further details).
- 2.3 Also, there is the generation of additional interest receipts of £194,000 mainly as a result of better interest rates than previously anticipated because of events in the money market linked to the credit crunch.
- 2.4 Due to market conditions there have been no sale of surplus LATS allowances to date. Officers will continue to review the situation.
- 2.5 ELWA's revised Contingency sum for 2007/08 agreed in February 2008 is £210,000 and comprises of £45,000 for staff recruitment costs, £40,000 for costs relating to Orange Bag Testing Trials and specialist advice and £125,000 for costs relating to biodegradability testing at Frog Island and Jenkins Lane. The agreed total utilisation to date is £108,000.
- 2.6 Currently, there are still some issues and uncertainties faced by ELWA but overall there could be an underspend for 2007/08.
- 2.7 Any revenue under-spend and unutilised contingency for the year will be added back to Revenue Reserves at the end of the year.

#### 3 Prudential Indicators

3.1 The Prudential Indicators for 2007/08, previously agreed by the Authority, covering borrowing, lending and capital expenditure limits are monitored by the Finance Director on a monthly basis. The Authority's Treasury Management and Capital activities for the eleven months to February 2008 remain within the limits set.
