Appendix B demonstrates why Police have concerns in relating to granting a premises licence for this venue.

It will clearly cause further distress to residents and their wellbeing, which needs to be at the forefront of the sub-committees decision making for this application.

Majority of the complaints are in relation to the noise element. When reviewing the times in which these complaints are made, they vary from after, evening and into the early hours of the morning. Whereby the residents are seen to clearly be asking for help from authorities.

The residential buildings are situated very close to the venue, which has been highlighted by the environmental protection officer.

Therefore, from a Police perspective, a suitable hour cannot be offered in order to grant this licence, as there is still the possibility of causing disturbance to residents.

Residents have not wished to provide their own statements, as they are concerned it will cause them further distress by entering into a political battle with the venue and organisers. This evidence supports the fact that the venue is highly likely to cause a detrimental affect under the Prevention of Public Nuisance Licensing Objective.
