



Declarations of interest

Nonpecuniary

 This is an interest which is not financial as defined, but is nevertheless so significant that the public with knowledge of the facts would regard it as impacting on the individual's ability to come to an impartial decision.

Pecuniary

 an interest that you have in a matter because of a reasonable likelihood or expectation of financial gain or loss.

Disclosable pecuniary

 One that is yours or your partner's as defined in the listings set down in national rules.







Continued...

- 1. My husband is a GP and one of the contracts I am going to vote on awarding could benefit the company / practice he works for
- 2. The contract I am going to vote on awarding could benefit my son's financial interests

When to declare an interest and dispensations?

- 3. I own 5% of shares in a company that has a health and social care contract, whose performance is subject to a report to the Board
- 4. I am given corporate tickets for a concert by a company, a director of which is a friend. The company subsequently tenders for a contract being awarded by the Board







The Role of the Monitoring Officer

Fiona Taylor, Head of Legal and Democratic Services, is the Council's Monitoring Officer. The post is established by the Local Government & Housing Act 1989.

Advising members and officers on the scope of powers and authority in relation to financial impropriety, probity, budget and policy framework issues

Having responsibility for matters relating to the conduct of Councillors, coopted members and Officers

Overseeing governance of LBBD and maintaining the Council's Constitution
