# Licensing Sub Committee Procedure for Premises Licence Applications (and Variations)

- All Parties introduced to the Sub Committee
- 2. The Procedure is read out.
- 3. The Licensing Officer will present the application.
- 4. Objectors that have made valid representations will be invited to speak. Statutory consultees (e.g. the Police, Fire Brigade etc.) will be invited to speak before any other objectors to the application. In the case of members of the public and other interested parties (for example: elected representatives acting on behalf of their constituents; local residents; interested organisations etc) who have made valid representations, they must have given notice of their intention to speak by 12.00 noon on the day before the Sub Committee meeting and will be given a target time of three minutes (or, at the discretion of the Chair, longer). Statutory consultees that have made valid representations are not required to register to speak at the meeting.
- 5. The Applicant will be given the opportunity to respond to the objections.
- The Sub Committee Members may, through the Chair, ask questions of the applicant / objectors / officers / other attendees at any time if they require clarification of what is being said or if they need general information in order to assist them in their considerations.
- 7. The Sub Committee will retire to consider its decision in private.
- 8. On returning, the Chair will announce the decision.

#### **Notes**

- Sub Committee Members should commit to stay for the duration of the meeting in order to ensure that the required quorum is maintained and the business is transacted.
- While each application is considered, Sub Committee Members should be in attendance for the entire period and should not leave the room at any time without the express permission of the Chair. With the Chair's agreement, the meeting will be adjourned until all Members are ready to recommence the hearing. Any Member leaving the meeting while it is ongoing will be precluded any further involvement in that application.
- A Sub Committee Member arriving late will not be able to take part in the consideration and decision-making process for any application to which he/she has not been in attendance for the entire period.
- The Council Licensing Policy for Licensing Act 2003 applications requires that Members of the Sub Committee will not hear cases that relate to premises in their own Ward.

#### **Summary**

An application for a variation of the premises licence held by Mr Jagtar Sandu in respect of the Ship & Shovel public house has been received.

Representations against the application have been received from the Metropolitan Police and the Licensing Authority as a responsible authority.

The matter is put to the Licensing Sub-Committee for determination at a public hearing, accordingly.

#### Recommendation

That the Sub-Committee considers the content of this report and appendices, together with any oral submissions given at the hearing, and determines the application.

#### Reason(s)

Under the Licensing Act 2003 the Council, as Licensing Authority for the area, has a duty to consider and determine each valid application submitted.

#### 1. Introduction and Background

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 (the "Act") established the national licensing regime for
  - The sale and supply of alcohol
  - Regulated entertainment
  - Late night refreshment
- 1.2 Under the Act, any person wishing to use any premises to provide one or more of the above licensable activities must firstly obtain a premises licence from the local

licensing authority for the area. If the licence is intended to include the sale and supply of alcohol, then the licence must name a 'Designated Premises Supervisor' (DPS) who holds a personal licence issued by the local licensing authority for the area within which they live.

- 1.3 Applications for premises licences are made subject to public consultation. During the consultation period, it is open to any 'responsible authority' or 'other person' to make representations concerning the application. Representations must relate to one or more of the four licensing objectives. These are:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - Public safety:
  - The prevention of public nuisance; and
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 1.4 Where representations are received, and these are neither conciliated or withdrawn, the local licensing authority must hold a public hearing to determine the matter.

#### 2. Proposal and Issues

#### The Application under Consideration

- 2.1 On 28 February 2019, Jagtar Sandu applied to vary the premises licence he holds in respect of the Ship & Shovel, Ripple Road Barking. A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix A.**
- 2.2 The premises are purpose built public house, facing onto the A13, east of the junction with Renwick Road.
- 2.3 The current premises licence (**Appendix B**) authorises the following hours and licensable activities:

#### Sale of alcohol (consumption off and on the premises)

Monday – Sunday 10:00 to 03:00

#### Live and recorded music

Monday - Sunday 10:00 to 03:00

#### Performance of dance

Monday – Sunday 10:00 to 03:00

#### Late night refreshment

Monday – Sunday 23:00 to 03:00

#### Hours the premises are open

Monday – Sunday 10:00 to 04:00

2.4 The variation applied for is to extend the current hours for licensable activities and to add some activities.

Activities added:

#### **Provision of plays**

Sunday – Thursday 10:00 – 04:00 Friday – Saturday 10:00 – 04:30

# Provision of anything similar to live music, recorded music or performances of dance:

Sunday – Thursday 10:00 – 04:00 Friday – Saturday 10:00 – 04:30

Activities varied:

#### Sale of alcohol (consumption on the premises)

Sunday – Thursday 10:00 – 04:00 Friday – Saturday 10:00 – 04:30

#### Live and recorded music

Sunday – Thursday 10:00 – 04:00 Friday – Saturday 10:00 – 04:30

#### Performance of dance

Sunday – Thursday 10:00 – 04:00 Friday – Saturday 10:00 – 04:30

On Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Easter and Bank Holidays all activities 10:00 – 05:30

On Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Easter and Bank Holidays 23:00 – 05:30

#### Hours the premises are open

On Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Years Day, Easter and Bank Holidays open 10:00 – 06:00.

- 2.5 The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) is Mr Vaidas Seselskas who holds overall responsibility for authorising alcohol sales made at the premises. He holds a personal licence issued by the London Borough of Redbridge.
- 2.6 The applicant, in his new operating schedule, offers a challenge 25 scheme as opposed to the current challenge 21 scheme. He also offers the use of an ID scanner. Both will become conditions added to the existing ones any new licence granted.

#### The Representations

- 2.7 One representation has been received in respect of this application from the Metropolitan Police. The representation is made under the crime prevention licensing objective. The Metropolitan Police oppose the variation of the licence. A copy of the representation is attached as **Appendix C**.
- 2.8 The Licensing Authority has made a representation, based on the inclusion in the operating schedule by the applicant, of the use of an ID Scanning machine. The Licensing Officer is asking for conditions to be included on the licence to make the use of such a machine enforceable and meaningful. A copy of the representation is attached as **Appendix D**.

#### Local Area

2.9 A map of the local area is attached as **Appendix E**. The location of the application premises is marked on the map.

#### 3. Options Appraisal

- 3.1 The Sub-Committee is advised that the hearing is of a quasi-judicial nature and representations from all parties, both written and verbal, will form part of the matters that are to be considered.
- 3.2 The Sub-committee is required to consider each application on its own individual merits with all relevant matters taken into account. Findings on issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 3.3 Having considered the application, the representations and all relevant submissions, the Sub-Committee must decide what action is appropriate to promote the licensing objectives. In doing so the Sub-Committee may decide either to grant, part-grant or refuse the application.
- 3.4 Any licence granted must be made subject to the mandatory licence conditions established by the Act and to conditions consistent with the measures proposed by the applicant to promote the licensing objectives (as amended by any conciliation process).
- 3.5 Any licence granted may be subject to additional conditions considered appropriate by the Sub-Committee to promote the licensing objectives.
- 3.6 In reaching its decision, the Sub-Committee must have regard to:

- The Act:
- Secondary regulations;
- The Guidance issued to Local Licensing Authorities by the Home Office (current version April 2018); and
- The Barking and Dagenham Statement of Licensing Policy for 2017-2022.
- 3.7 The options open to the Committee are:
  - To grant the application;
  - To refuse to grant the application; or
  - To grant the application subject to additional conditions.
- 3.8 In the event that any party is aggrieved by the decision of the Sub-Committee, they have the right to appeal the decision to the Magistrates Court. Appeals must be made within 21 days of notification of the Sub-Committee's decision.

#### 4. Consultation

4.1 The application has been subject of public consultation in accordance with the statutory provisions. The application has been advertised by way of public notices placed in a local newspaper, displayed at the premises and published on the Council website. Notifications have been provided to all responsible authorities and ward councillors.

#### 5. Legal Implications

Implications completed by: Paul Feild, Senior Lawyer, Standards and Corporate Governance

- 5.1 The London Borough of Barking and Dagenham, as Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 and subordinate legislation, is empowered to determine applications of this nature.



- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or,

- 2. Every supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- a) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- b) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- c) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
  - 1. a holographic mark, or .
  - an ultraviolet feature.

4.

- (A). A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (B). For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(6);
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula where-

$$P = D = (D X V)$$

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
  - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is

in force a premises licence-

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,

- 5. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:
- a) unauthorised access or occupation (eg through door supervision), or
- b) outbreaks of disorder, or
- c) damage
- 6. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— .
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or .
    - (ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; .


- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 8. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
  - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and,
  - (ii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and .
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

## Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. A personal licence holder to be on the premises from 11.00pm when alcohol is available for sale, supply or consumption.
- 2. The premises shall operate in accordance with the "Challenge 21" scheme, at a minimum. This scheme operates on the basis that whilst alcohol may be sold to persons aged 18 years and over, anyone who appears under 21 years of age will be asked for ID. Notices to this effect should be displayed in a clear and prominent position at the premises. The only proof of age accepted in respect of the sale of alcohol shall be photo driving licence, passport, or other trade organisation and police approved photographic identification being the PASS hologram.
- 3. A CCTV system shall be installed, kept and maintained at all times during the currency of the licence. The CCTV system serving the premises shall:
  - a. be maintained, fully operational and in good working order at all times
  - b. make and retain clear facial images at the point of entry
  - c. the CCTV recordings shall show an accurate date and time that the recordings were made and all recordings shall be retained for a period of no less than 31 days
  - d. the original, or a copy of the CCTV recording, shall be provided upon demand to any police officer, community support officer or other authorised person
  - e. copies of CCTV recordings shall be provided in a format that can be viewed on readily available equipment without the need for specialist software
  - f. member of staff is on duty at the premises and able to operate the system fully at all times the licence is in force.
- 4. On Fridays and Saturdays from 8.00pm Security Industry Authority (SIA) licensed door supervisors are to be employed. They shall be employed on a ratio of one door supervisor to per 100 patrons or part thereof, whichever is greater. Door supervisors shall be in position early enough in the evening to ensure that procedures for promoting public safety are effective, and shall remain on duty until the premises are closed.
- 5. Between the hours of 23:00 and 04:00 every day, there shall be six licensed door supervisors employed including one female at all times.
- 6. A log of SIA staff on duty shall be maintained at the premises and are to be kept for at least three years and made available to Police and Officers at request.
- 7. SIA door staff to wear high visibility clothing.
- 8. No drink vessels of any kind to be taken outside of the premises after 11.00pm.
- 9. Polycarbonate glasses to be used at the premises when requested by Police.
- 10. A secure drugs box shall be installed and all confiscated illegal drugs to be placed into the box. Police are to be called to dispose of the confiscated drugs. All seizures to be recorded in an incident log.

- 11. Police to be called to the premises whenever a customer is found in possession of a quantity of drugs inconsistent with personal use.
- 12. A lockable weapons box is to be installed where all seized weapons are to be kept until handed over to Police.
- 13. Signs to be prominently displayed inside and outside the premises warning customers that drug use on the premises will not be tolerated and they may be searched on entry.
- 14. All staff shall receive training at least every six months on the prevention of underage sales. All managers shall receive training in the use of the fitted CCTV system. Such training shall be recorded in a Staff Training Log showing what training has been given to whom, by whom and on what date and signed by the DPS as correct. These records shall, on request, be made available on demand to a police officer, community support officer or authorised officer of the Licensing Authority.
- 15. Signs will be displayed asking customers to leave the premises quietly and to respect the neighbours.
- 16. During the provision of regulated entertainment, staff will regularly check the outside areas in order to monitor any escape of noise.
- 17. During the provision of regulated entertainment, doors and windows will be kept closed except for access to and egress from the premises.
- 18. Any persons who have been ejected from premises by staff shall not be allowed to reenter the premises in the same opening period of the said premises.

The reason for my objection is under prevention of crime and disorder and public safety. There have been numerous incidents (12 recorded) at the venue both inside and outside over the past 12 months. In particular there have been in last 4 weeks three serious assaults on 29/12/2018 at 0310hrs and 20/01/2019 at 0300hrs, at 0339hrs on 10/02/2019. These incidents have involved serious violence, assaults. Have involved intoxicated subjects who have come from or have been inside the Venue. Most incidents recorded are in the early hours of the Morning in and around the end time as stated on the current premises license.

We object on the grounds of the above.

In the operating schedule for your variation application you make reference under the objectives of the prevention of crime and disorder, and the protection of children from harm, of the use of an ID scanner.

This is welcome, however because conditions derived from an operating schedule need to be enforceable it is not enough just to reference the use of such equipment.

I am making a representation about the application, I seek to include the following as conditions, based on your use of an ID scanner:

The premises shall adopt a club ID scan or a suitable equivalent which shall be utilised as part of the conditions of entry after 21:00 on any day where SIA door supervisors are engaged.

Patrons seeking to enter will be subject to the entry process whereby a photograph may be taken, fingerprints may be taken. Documentation will be required to enable identification to take place.

The scanning device shall be capable of reading passports, ID cards and PASS cards.

The Id scanner data should be provided to police and responsible authorities on request.

Please reply indicating whether or not you accept these conditions. If you so I shall withdraw my representation and these will become conditions attached to any new licence issued.
