CODE OF CORPORATE GOVERNANCE	FOR DECISION
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Summary

In line with a framework produced by CIPFA (the Chartered Institute of Public Finance & Accountancy) and SOLACE (the Society of Local Authority Chief Executives and Senior Managers), the Council agreed a Code of Corporate Governance towards the end of 2003. It is included in the Council Constitution.

The Code is an expression of the Council's commitment to good corporate governance and it provides an explanation of what the Council does to achieve this.

The Council put in place an annual review process to make sure that the Code is kept up to date. Accordingly, a review has recently taken place and a few, very minor, changes are proposed. The changes are shown in bold type on the appended Code.
