CONSENT ORDER

=====

UPON the parties having reached agreement that the appeal can be compromised as set out in this Order

BY CONSENT it is ordered:

1. The Appeal is allowed to the extent that the revocation of the premises licence is overturned, and the following conditions are added to the premises licence, in addition to the conditions within Annexes 1 and 3 of the Premises Licence:
 - a. The premises licence holder shall be security-trained and SIA-registered
 - b. There shall be at least one SIA-registered door supervisor on duty between 1700 and close on any day on which the premises is open to members of the public for licensable activities;

c. Strictly only members and
one bona fide guest per member

..... ~~only~~ shall be
allowed entry to the premises;

d. Any member wishing to sign in a guest must ensure that their guest's name and home address is recorded in a book; the book is to be kept on the premises and available at all times

e. The premises shall operate a membership policy whereby:

i. No person under 18 shall be permitted to be a member or be present on the premises after 1700 on any day.

ii. Prior to 1700, any person under 18 shall only be permitted entry if accompanied by a member

iii. No person shall be admitted to membership, be described as a member, or afforded the privileges of membership (including access to the premises) unless at least 48 hours have elapsed since that person's application to membership in writing;

iv. Any person wishing to become a member must apply in writing and provide with their application their full name, home address and a form of photographic ID (passport, driving licence or other official photographic ID) such that their details can be recorded and held at the premises in a register of members;

v. The premises licence holder must ensure that a register of current members, including their full name, home address and a copy of their photographic ID is kept at the premises and is available to be inspected on request by a police officer or officer of the local authority.

f. A search policy shall be drawn up in agreement with the Police Licensing Team and shall be implemented whenever the premises are open for licensable activities. Information to be included in the policy shall include, but is not limited to:

i. Regular searches of patrons upon entry to the premises;

- ii. All seizures of drugs, and offensive weapons/firearms to be recorded in a register;
 - iii. Immediate refusal of entry (and immediate cancellation of membership) to anyone found with any drugs, or offensive weapons/firearms on their person (such refusal to be recorded in the refusals log);
 - iv. The disposal method of any seized goods, and specification of secure deposit box for such purposes, which deposit box must be kept locked and secured in a secure area to which customers have no access, and shall be accessed only by the Premises Licence Holder or Police; every incident of accessing the box (whether to deposit seized items or otherwise) shall be recorded in the incident book;
 - v. Access to the register to be restricted to management only at all times, with the names of those permitted access to be recorded and kept by the premises licence holder;
 - vi. A policy for notifying police of any seizures, whether by 999 or 101.
- g. The premises shall operate a 'behave or be banned' policy at all times.
 - h. The PLH shall ensure that reasonable and adequate staff training shall be provided and proper records kept of training undertaken, including details of topics covered and those undergoing the training. The training shall include: dealing with incidents, the prevention of crime and disorder, responsible alcohol sales (including to underage persons, persons over 18 buying for minors, drunks etc). Only those who have undergone training shall be permitted to sell alcohol at the premises.
 - i. There shall be a CCTV system at the premises covering all public areas of the premises, to a standard approved by the Police.
 - j. The PLH shall ensure that the CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities, and during all times when customers are on the premises, and signage to this effect shall be displayed.
 - k. The PLH shall ensure that all CCTV recordings shall be stored for a minimum of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available as soon as practicable following a request by a police officer or authorised officer.
